BARGAINING BEGINS JUNE 26

Stonewall: 50 years later

HOW A COMMUNITY ROSE TOGETHER TO FIGHT FOR EQUALITY AND SOCIAL JUSTICE

Our fight for social, economic and environmental justice is deeply rooted in history, and we're inspired by the efforts of the pioneers who stood up to make a difference in the fight for equality.

In the early hours of June 28, 1969, New York City police raided the Stonewall Inn, a gay club located in Greenwich Village in New York City. The raid sparked a riot among bar patrons and neighborhood residents as police roughly hauled employees and patrons out of the bar, leading to six days of protests and violent clashes with law enforcement outside the bar, in neighboring streets and in nearby Christopher Park. The Stonewall Riots served as a catalyst for the gay rights movement in the U.S. and around the world.

Though the Stonewall uprising didn't start the gay rights movement, it was a galvanizing force for LGBTQ political activism, leading to the founding of numerous gay rights organizations, including the Gay Liberation Front, Human Rights Campaign, GLAAD (Gay and Lesbian Alliance Against Defamation) and PFLAG (Parents, Families and Friends of Lesbians and Gays).

In 2016, President Barack Obama designated the site of the riots—Stonewall Inn, Christopher Park, and the surrounding streets and sidewalks—a national monument in recognition of the area's contribution to gay and human rights.

We celebrate Pride month by honoring those whose heroic actions still resonate five decades later.
