Community was important too: Joe was the chair of our Latino/ Latina committee and participated in the statewide committee that helped to create California's Cesar Chavez Day holiday.


We congratulate Joe Chacon for his tireless efforts in helping his union and his fellow workers make progress in securing social, economic and environmental justice for all Californians.

New Class of Stewards Selected

Our Chief Stewards Committee has selected the newest class of 60 participants in our Leadership Apprentice Program for Stewards (LAPS), and they will begin their six-month training in January. Another 60 new stewards will graduate this month, bringing the program's total to more than 400 new stewards in the 2+ years the LAPS program has been running.

LAPS training includes a combination of online, classroom and in-the-field experience. Skilled mentors from our organizing and representational staff offer guidance along the way.
