

Bankers got their bailouts & bonuses – where's ours?



CEO Bonuses in 2009

- **Goldman Sachs:**
\$9 million
- **American Express:**
\$17.4 million
- **Wells Fargo:**
\$21.3 million
- **JP Morgan:**
\$17 million

In 2008, Congress gave U.S.-based banks over \$700 billion in Troubled Asset Relief Program (TARP) bailout funds to get them back on their feet. Those same banks are doing so well they paid out over \$74 billion in bonuses and compensation in 2009.

During this same period they continued to foreclose on homeowners, restrict lending to small businesses, and increase credit card fees and penalties on the rest of us. Isn't it time to hold banks accountable and demand that they pay their fair share?

- The U.S. has lost \$6 trillion in homeowner wealth since 2006.
- Every 13 seconds another American home goes into foreclosure.
- Over 5.3 million Americans have lost their jobs over the last 18 months.
- In the first quarter of 2010 there were 200,000 foreclosures in California—the highest rate in the country.
- In Sacramento County almost 20,000 houses are in foreclosure or in default.
